That may be as simple as reading over part of the book several times and consulting an online commentary to learn more about what the author is saying. Matthew Henry's commentary is available online for free and has stood the test of time for a reason. It doesn't take a great deal of money to find helpful resources! As we finish Romans and look to texts elsewhere in the Bible, I would encourage you to find times to dig deeper for yourself. I have known a number of Christians who have made such a practice in their own lives and find that it produces a great impact in their own walk with God. Study hard! The text is worth it.
