

ASSOCIATE PASTOR NEWS:


NFBC Family,

This book will help you do just that. It is thoroughly biblical which I consider to be the main point on which a book should be evaluated and is written in plain language that everyone will understand. This is no dry academic work and there is no need for a seminary degree to understand what Dever is saying. As always, I invite you to check this book out for yourself to deepen your understanding of what the Bible says about a healthy church.
