FROM THE PASTOR'S ...

This month we celebrate *Father's Day* and their influence in **family** and **church life**. The first recognition of this holiday in North America was on the West Coast, however, honoring fathers has been traced to the Catholic Feast of St Joseph back in the 14th Century. Joseph was venerated a saint as the nourisher of Christ. He doesn't play a prominent role in the story of Christ, but yet he lays down an example that many 21st Century men would do well to follow.

Matthew 1:19 calls Joseph a "just man." The word meant upright, righteous, obeying God's laws. As the Bible mentions him, we also see his compassion in not punishing his wife for supposed infidelity. We see his faith in the Word of God. He was a man of courage in standing for his own principles and not following the rigid traditions of a legalistic society. Joseph seems to be a hard worker, protector and provider. This is demonstrated in the fact that he was a carpenter (**Matthew 13:55**) and he took Mary & Jesus to Egypt to escape wicked King Herod (**Matthew 2:13-14**).

Joseph is often overlooked in a study of the life of Christ, but he was there until he likely passed away. All mention of him just fades from the text as Jesus grew from boyhood. The Bible calls us to honor all of our parents (**Exodus 20:12**). Some fathers have fallen short of honorable lives. Hopefully this holiday brings you pleasant memories, and even if not, may it challenge you to leave good memories for the generations that follow.

May you have a happy kick-off to summer and a happy Father's Day to all of our dads.



We need more Christians who have read the Bible and have read it well. We do not come into this world skilled at reading the Scriptures and it takes hard work to become good at it! However, the reward for working hard at this task is rich and well worth the effort.

Ferguson does one of the best jobs that I have seen of presenting how to study the Bible in a concise manner. He briefly teaches on why we can trust the Bible and how to apply the Scriptures in our lives. All the Bible study in the world will not help us if we do not apply that truth to our lives! Regardless of your level of skill in Bible study, I would encourage you to make it a lifelong task to enrich your skill in this area.
