It is easily read and understood.

Its story, while simple, illustrates several biblical truths such as the ability of ordinary, unremarkable people who accomplish more than they might expect, the dangers of greed and the triumph of good over evils. While the setting of this story is fictional, the messages contained in its pages are anything but fictional.
